Bishop Goff will be retiring in 2-3 years.

A Culpeper Region Rep was chosen for the Executive Board. Mary Ann Cowherd accepted.

- 1. Healing Across Differences and Including All
- 2. Strengthening over Our Financial Health
- 3. Sharing the Faith of Jesus with Youth and Others
- 4. Honoring and Caring for God's Creation

The National Church and our Diocese are identifying Racial Reconciliation as a priority. A session was held January 25 with Dr. Catherine Meeks. The next step is to find diocesan trainers and to "Train the trainers." Several Resources, Films and Books were suggested.

The Region Meeting plans to have Bishop Jennifer and Paris Ball in April and June.

Bishop Susan is coming March 1 for Confirmation. March 22 the Brandy Station and Remington Fire Stations are holding a chicken dinner fundraiser for Shiloh Baptist.

Trinity Washington will be participating in the Lenten Preaching Service with several churches in the county participating. A potluck is enjoyed with 2 sermons and one choir leading the music. Money is collected for outreach - this year for the Rappahannock Food Pantry.

Little Fork is happy to have their new priest, Stacy Williams-Duncan. There is added energy and new people attending. Their organ needs works and they were looking for a piano. Funds were raised and one located. Adjustment must be made to a box pew to hold the instrument.

- St. Stephen's Culpeper hosted a Jazz Concert last Sunday with students from the Blue Ridge School.
- St. James Warrenton is missed.
